How will the COVID-19 pandemic affect women in the organised workforce in Indian towns and cities? What impact will it have on their personal and professional lives and relationships? For many Indian women workers, the office is an escape from the tyranny of the patriarchal restrictions, especially those on meeting people who are not relatives and neighbours. The office is the site where a woman's work offers her a chance to sharpen her skills, build expertise in teamwork, and generally be a part of a larger goal beyond the domestic walls.

The most significant factor is that articles about the post-COVID work scenario have referred mostly to corporate offices and an educated, white-collar workforce. Considering that 93% of India's workforce is in the informal sector, the work-from-home scenario is hardly feasible for the majority of people. The location of work for a huge section of domestic labour is other people's homes. Urban areas in India are witnessing a burgeoning gig economy, wherein workers do not always operate from offices. Even in urban offices, not every member of the staff has a personal computer or laptop at home. A vast majority of these people depends on computers and internet connections in their offices even for their personal work like bill payments, travel bookings, online shopping, etc. During the current crisis, the employee who has the ability to use technology from home or away from the office is much in demand. The questions that come to mind are: Will this mean that those who do not have technology access in their homes will be relegated to a lower grade/pay? What is the company/management's responsibility to ensure that its employees are helped to upgrade their skills and also their access to technology? Experts have also predicted a breaking up or loosening of hierarchies in offices. It would be interesting to see how far this would hold true of Indian corporate setups where the patriarchal, even feudal social patterns from society are faithfully mirrored.

- Commuting for work in India, as in many other places, also involves "socialising" with fellow commuters, bonding over the long hours spent together. "Train friends" are a common feature and celebrations of personal milestones and festivals are also regular occurrences. Mumbai's suburban commuter trains that carry lakhs of people daily also support an entire world of informal workers who hawk and sell everything from safety pins to fruits and vegetables, and also ready to wear garments and accessories. How will the "work" of this huge number change?

As with the physical workspace, these modes of transport are sources of personal and professional interactions which contribute to productivity on both these fronts. These are areas where change may not necessarily be welcome.

The concept of 'frame' suggests that an item of information, whether arising from media, from other sources, or from direct perception, is invested with meaning only once it is placed in a context of other information. In framing certain items of information, we simultaneously bracket these from potentially endless masses of information. The focus is shifted away from information as discrete entities, and toward the complex and socially specific worldviews that audiences hold. Compared to 'agendas', which may be understood as a temporary set of priorities, 'frames' amount to more permanent dispositions of a social or mental variety. As such, frames are of special interest for understanding the media-society nexus, but correspondingly difficult to operationalize in empirical research.

Researchers showed how audiences would rely on frames which were derived largely from personal experience in order to make sense of the news – interpretive frames that differed from those offered by the news media. This is consistent with reception studies which have found that audiences employ 'super-themes' in order to establish meaningful links between the worlds of news and of everyday life.

One further potential of the concept of frames is that it enables a more detailed comparison of media production and reception. On the one hand, journalists and other media professionals are constantly engaged in framing content, and in anticipating how they may be interpreted. On the other hand, media audiences necessarily employ interpretive frames that are generated and reformulated over time, with reference to media as well as other sources. Presumably, audiences in their turn are also aware that both news professionals and other sources have a stake in the dissemination of particular perspectives, which can be resisted.

Agenda-setting and framing may represent different, but interrelated aspects of media impact. While the process of issue selection or agenda-setting by mass media needs to be a conscious one, framing is based on subtle nuances in wording and syntax and therefore most likely has unintentional effects, or at least effects that are hard to protect and control by journalists. Framing has introduced another important differentiation in the notion of effects, since framing influences *how* audiences think about issues, just as agenda-setting influences *what* issues to think about. The larger argument is that journalists and editors put reality together, bringing some aspects into view, while excluding others. Some scholars have suggested that this process may involve a routine imposition of an ideological framework.

Was Christopher Columbus really from Genoa, in Italy? Or was he Spanish? Or, as some other theories have it, was he Portuguese or Croatian or even Polish?

A definitive answer to the question of where the famous explorer came from could be just five months away as international scientists on Wednesday launched an effort to read the DNA from his remains and identify his geographic origin. Their findings are to be made public in October.

Knowledge of the 15th-century navigator's early life is scant. A major breakthrough in establishing a fuller profile of the man who died 515 years ago came after DNA tests in 2003 established that bones in a tomb in the cathedral of Seville were those of Columbus. But after that discovery, the research team from Spain's University of Granada that is leading the Columbus research decided to halt its investigation. The reason: DNA technology at the time was neither accurate nor reliable and required a significant amount of genetic material.

After leaps in the sophistication of DNA testing in recent years, gene geography may now ascertain the rough area of a European person's ancestry.

José Antonio Lorente, a professor of forensic medicine at Granada University, said there had been a "radical" improvement in DNA analysis, which now permits tests on very small fragments. He said researchers are working with four small bone fragments from Columbus, seven bone fragments and a tooth from his son Hernando, and a dozen bone fragments in poor condition from his brother Diego. The fragments are being sent to genetic identification laboratories in Rome and Florence in Italy, Mexico and the United States, Lorente told an online press conference.

Mr. Lorente said he believes the generally accepted theory that Columbus was from Genoa, bu the project aims to resolve some "mysteries...and contradictions" in the historical record and obtain "as much information as possible...so that there is no argument."

Granada University on Wednesday was hosting what it called the first world meeting of Columbus researchers, who are presenting evidence for their different theories about the explorer's origins.

Columbus's four transatlantic voyages on behalf of the Spanish monarchs between 1492 and 1504 opened a door to Europe's colonization of the Americas, then known as the New World. Columbus died on May 20, 1506 and was buried in the Spanish city of Valladolid, though he had asked to be buried in the Americas.
