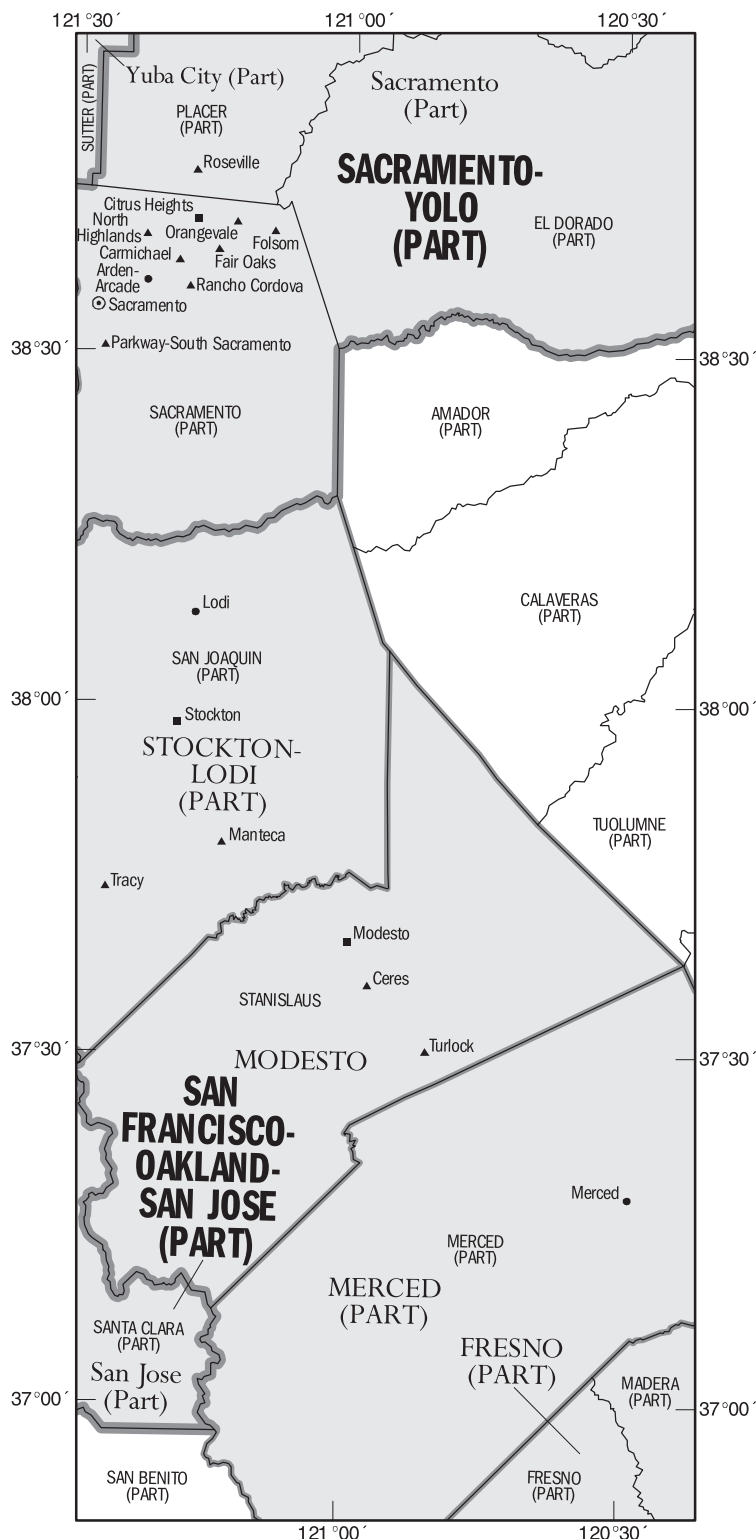

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA - Metropolitan Area, District of Columbia, Counties, Independent Cities, and Selected Places

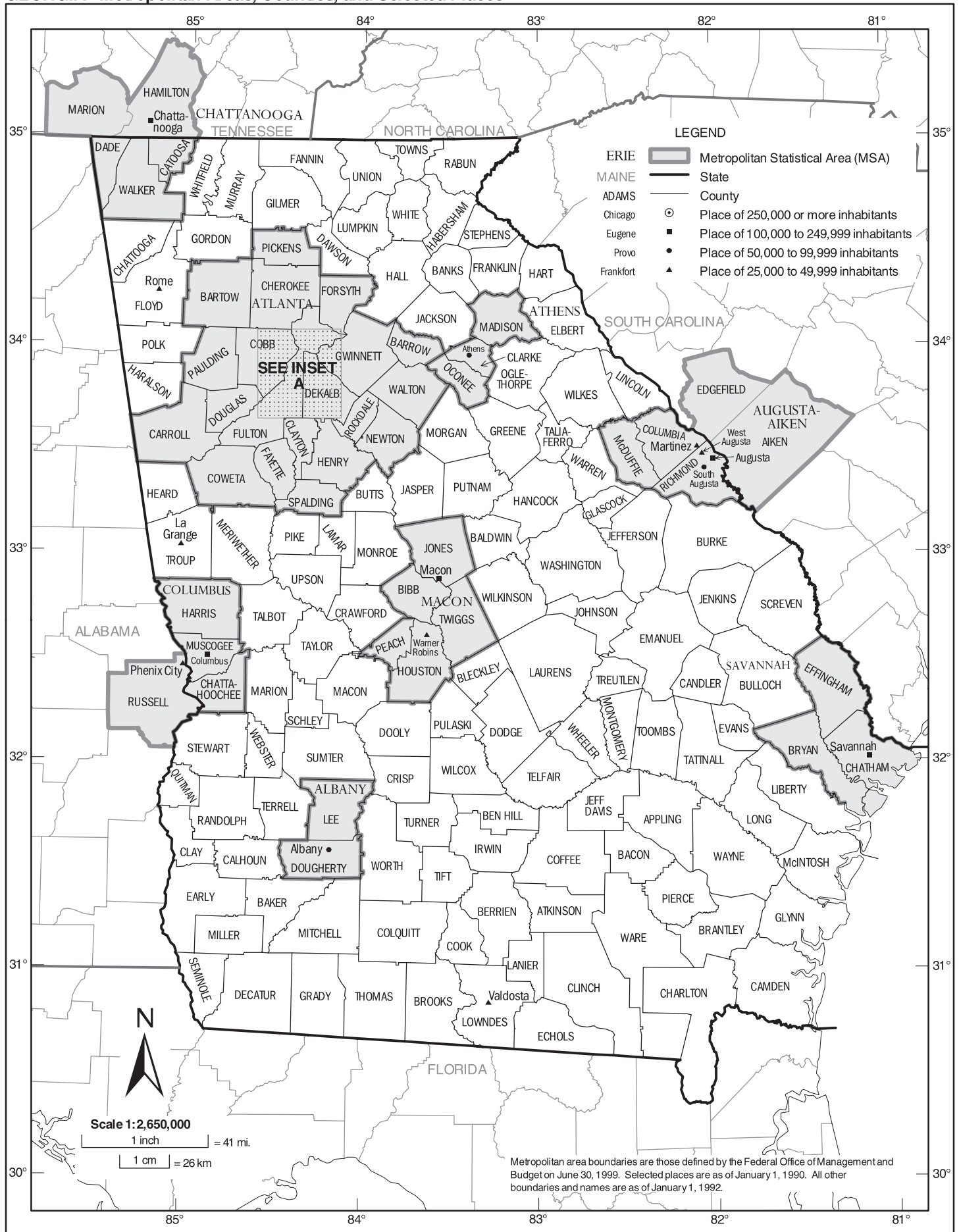




FLORIDA (Inset A) - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

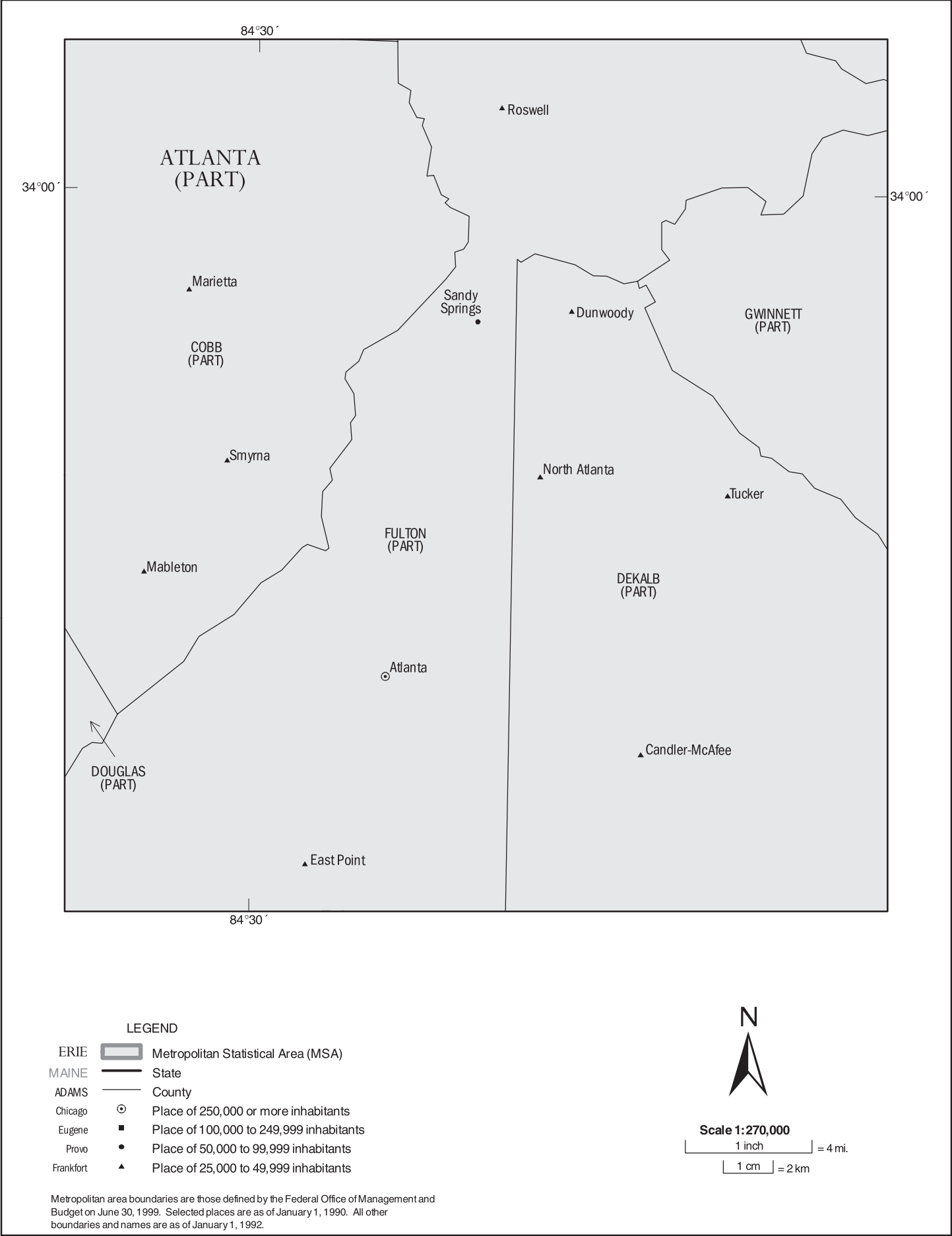


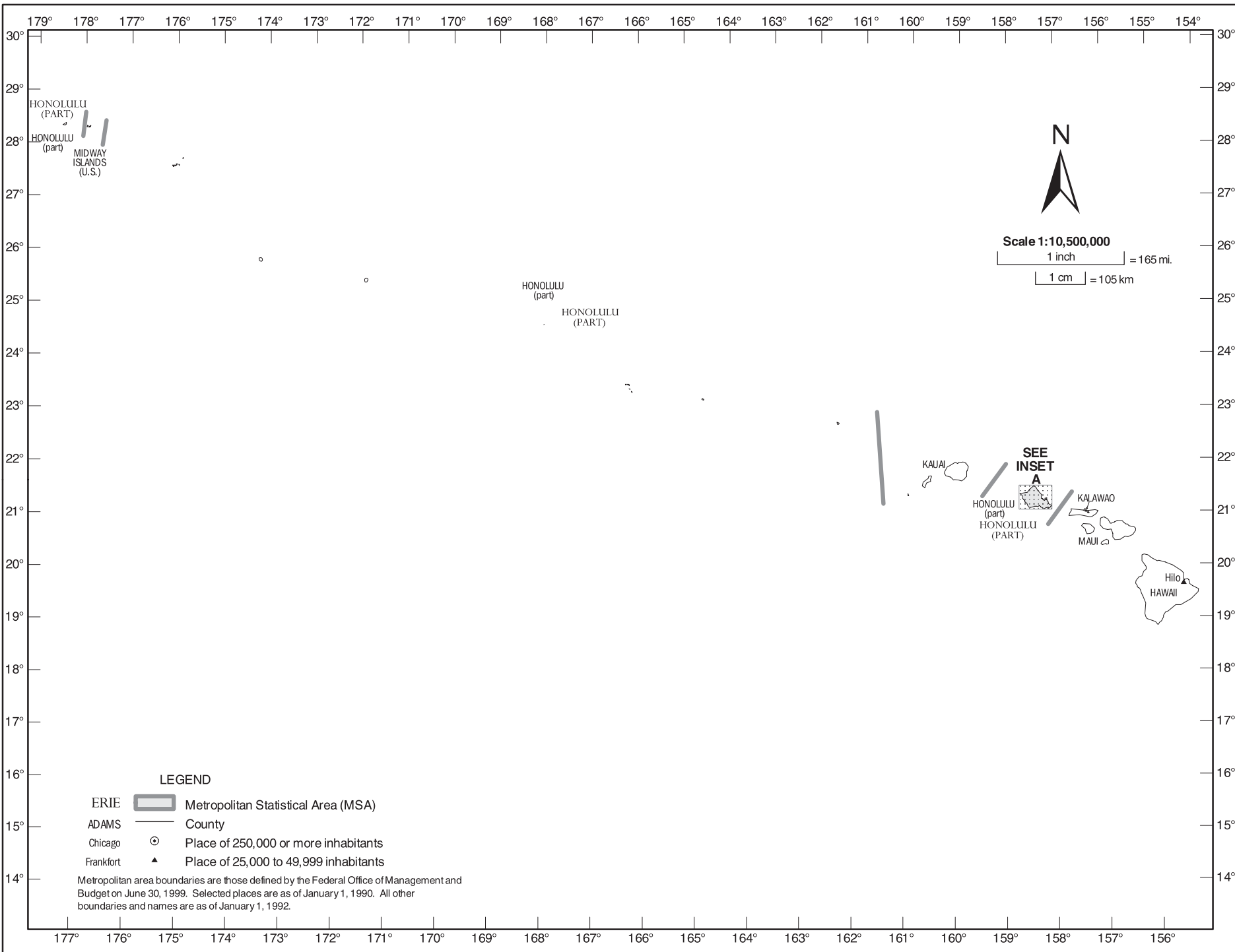

IDAHO - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places



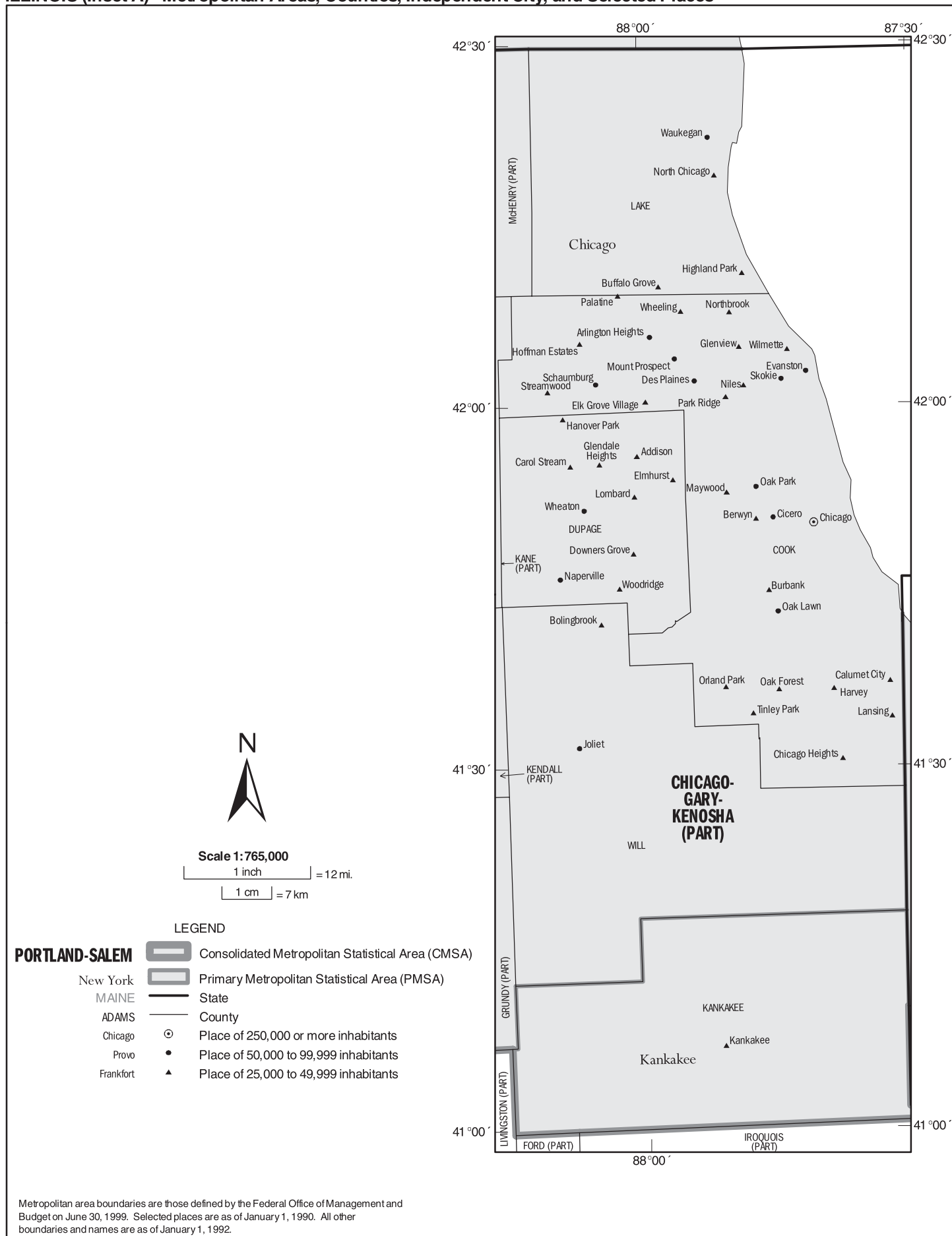

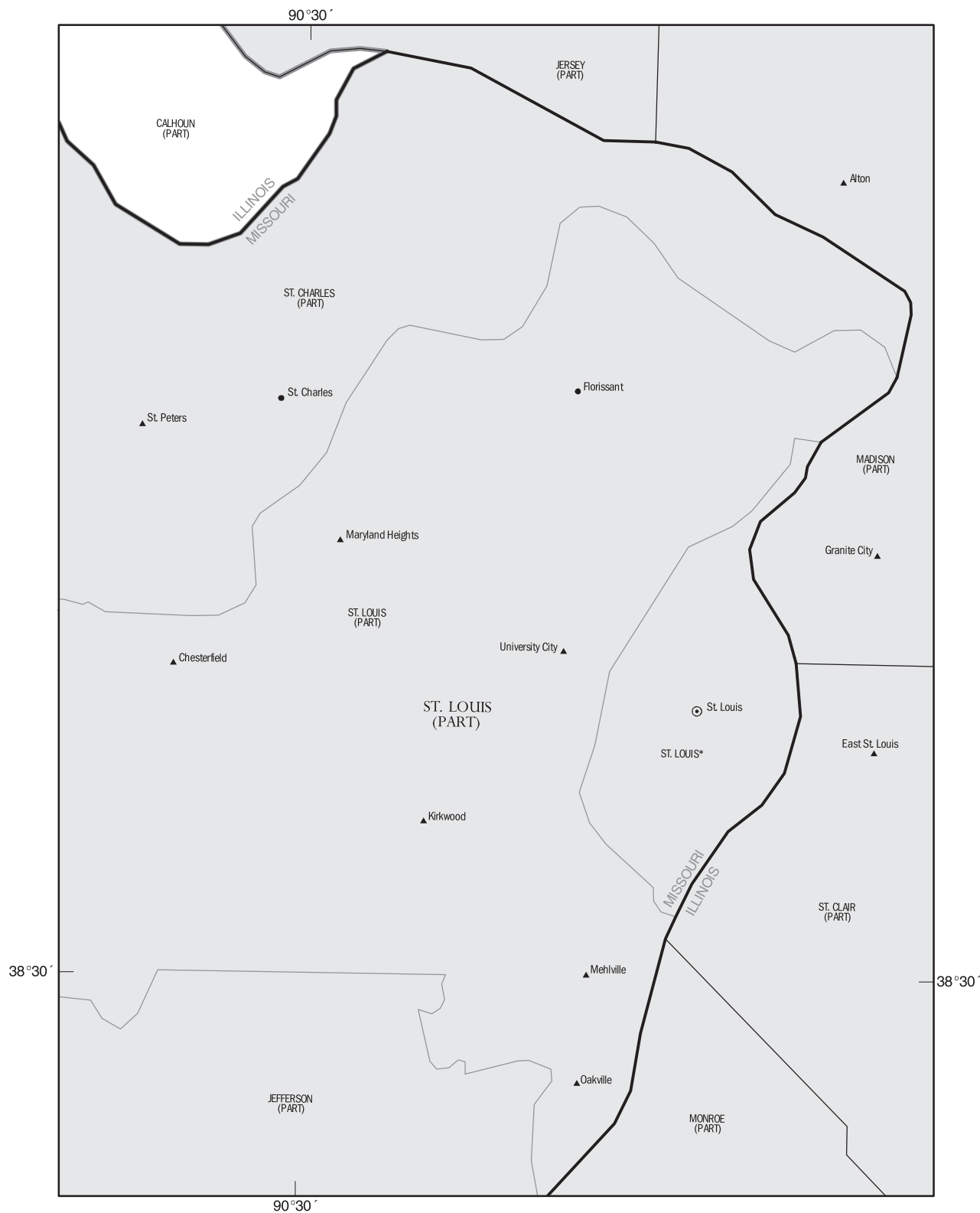

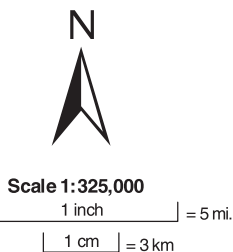

ILLINOIS (Inset B) - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, Independent City, and Selected Places



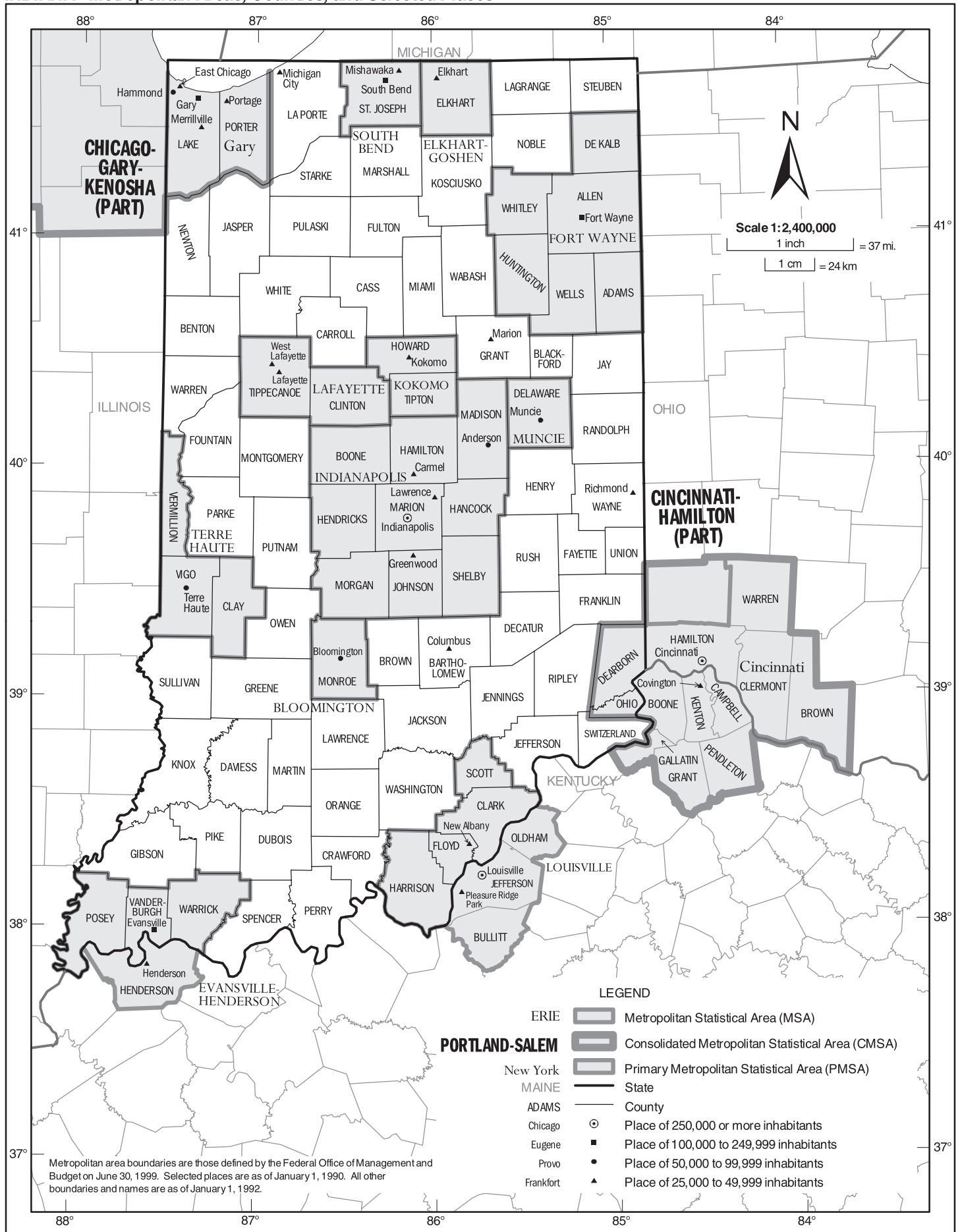

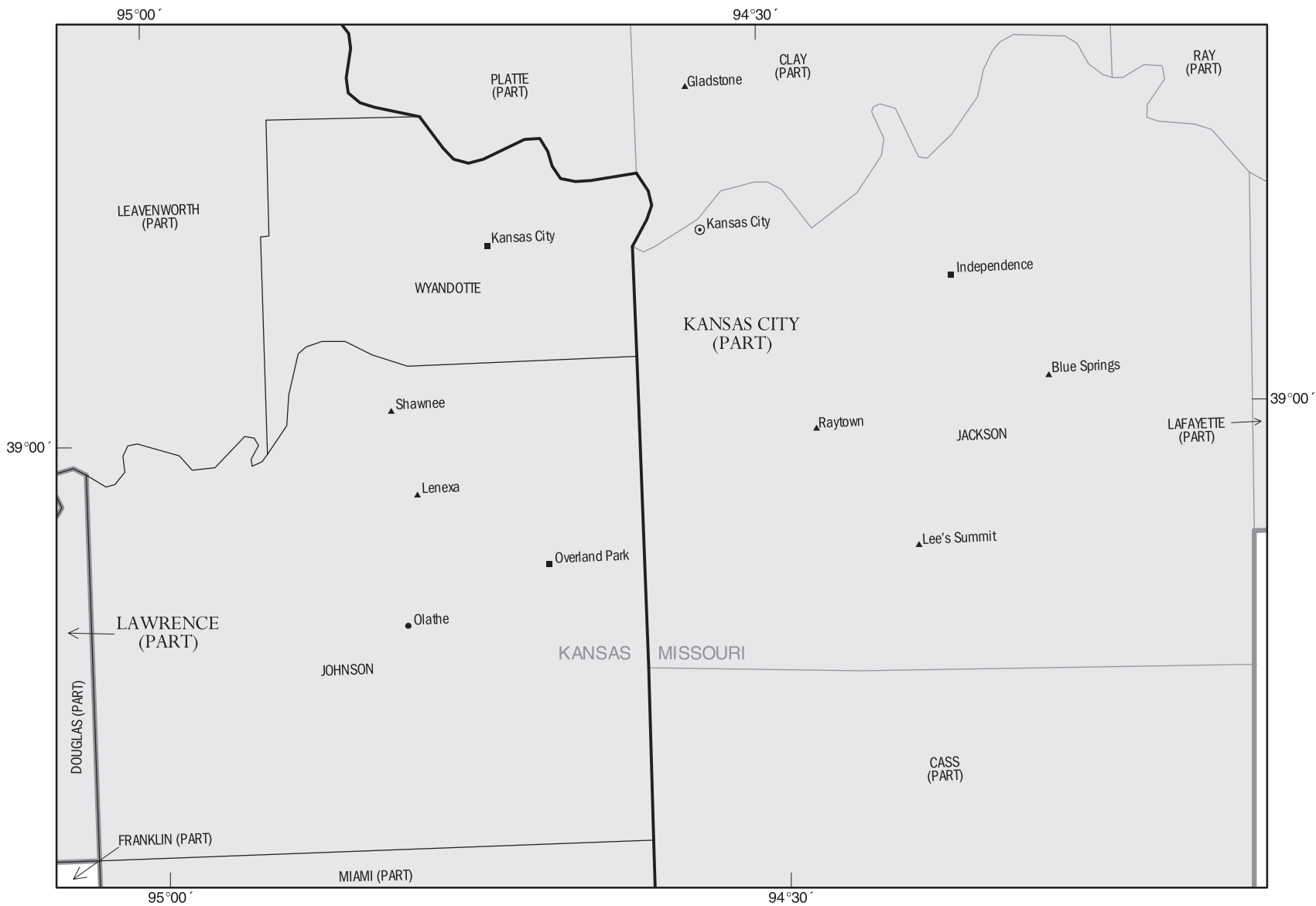
INDIANA - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

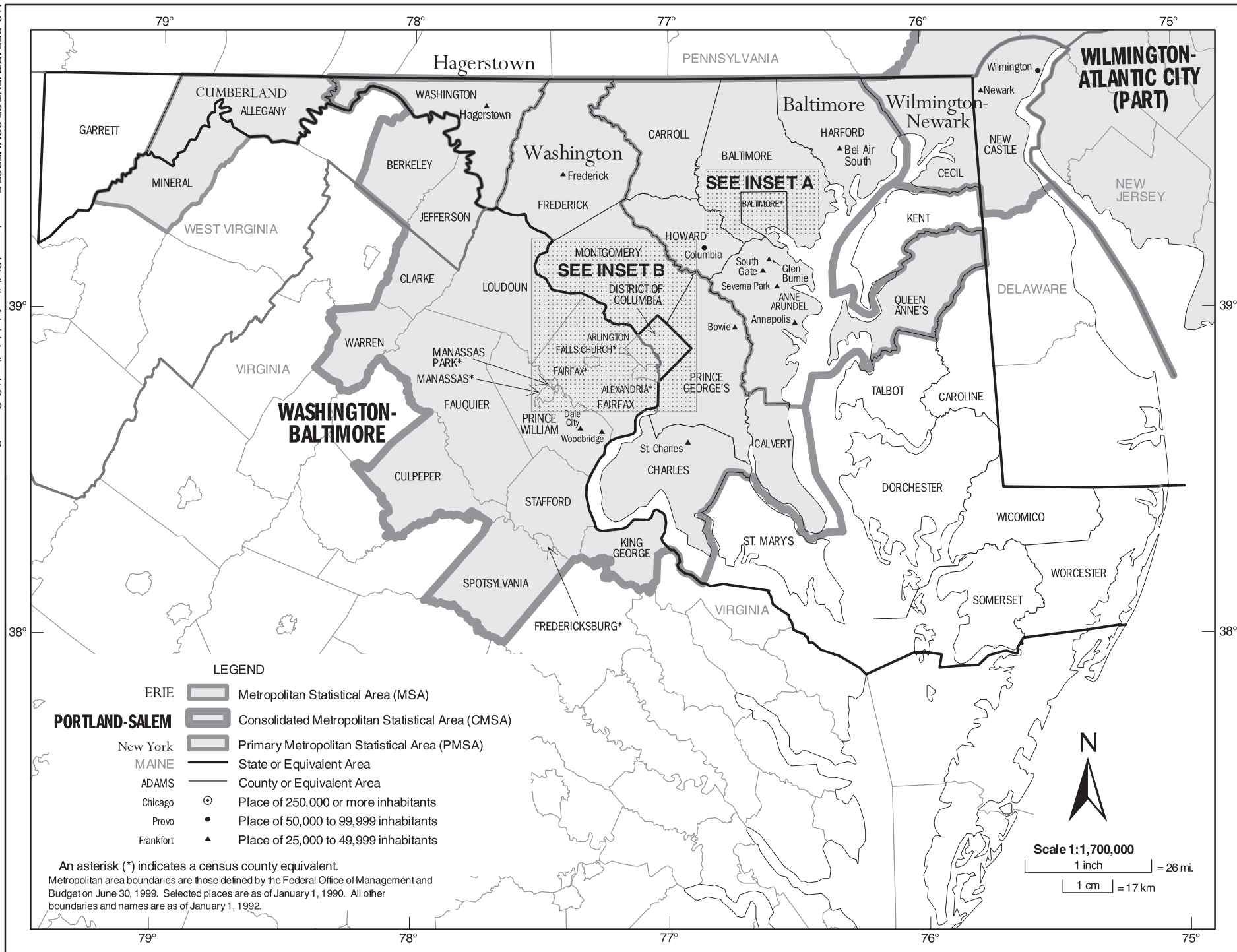


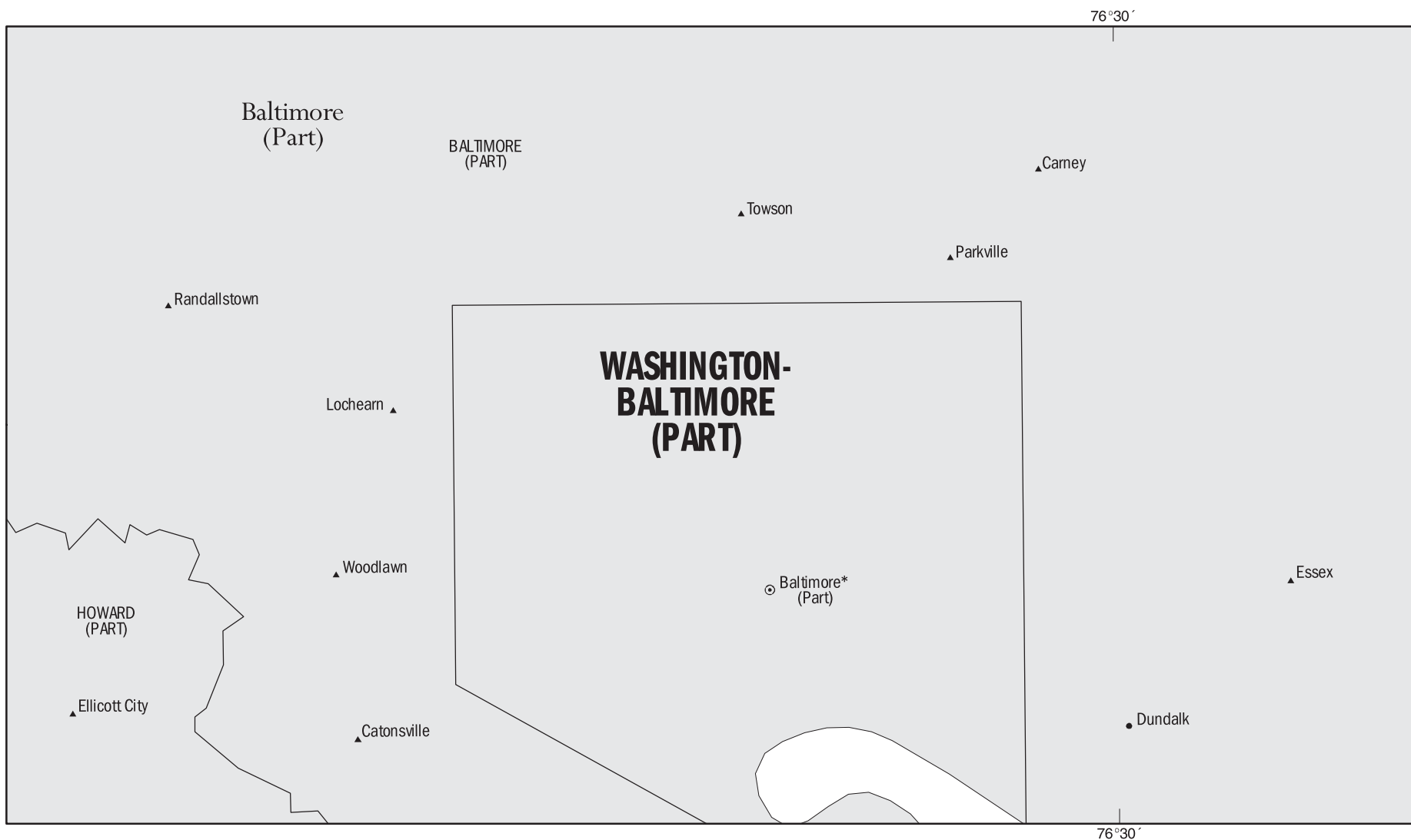


MAINE - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

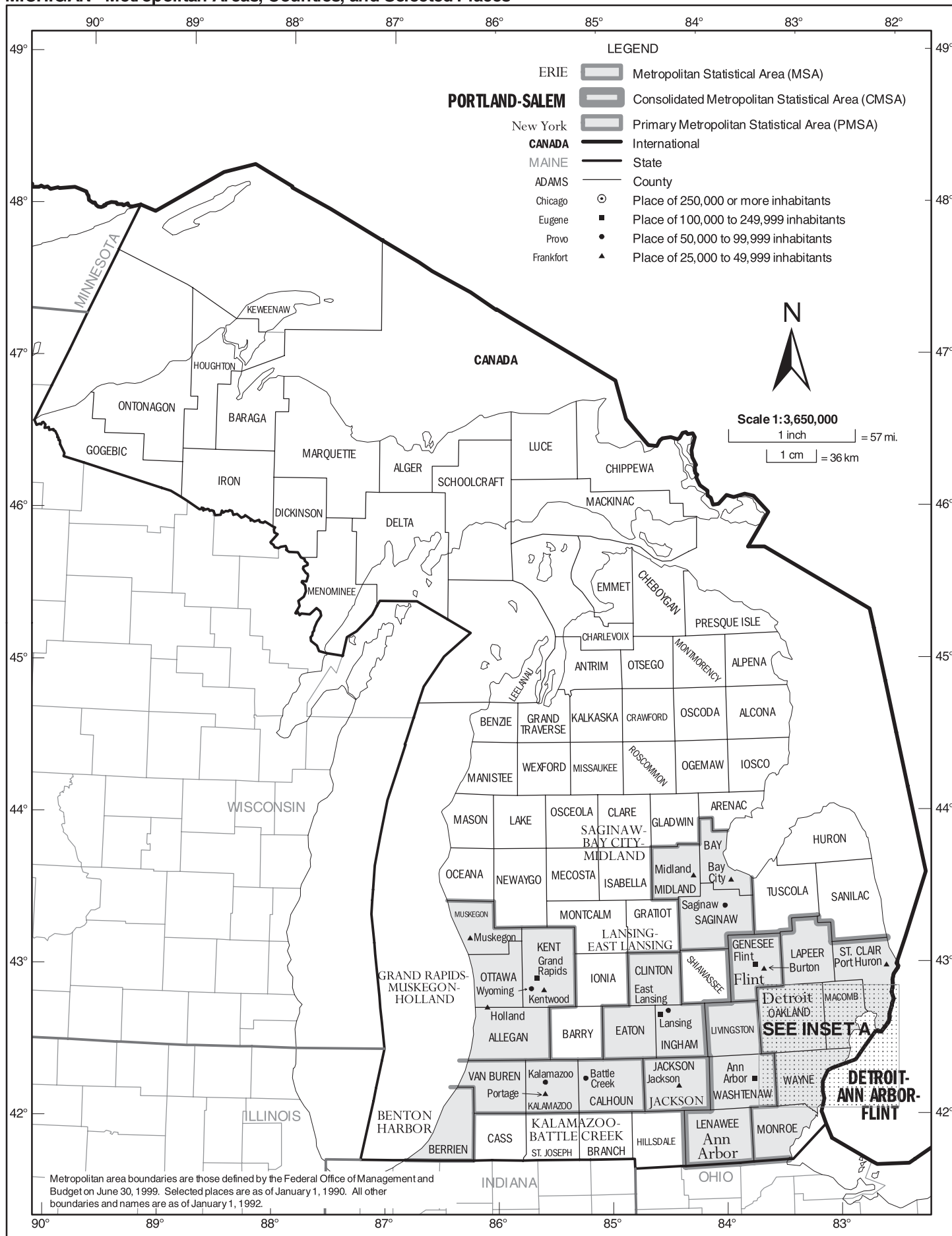
MARYLAND (Inset B) - Metropolitan Areas, District of Columbia, Counties, Independent Cities, and Selected Places



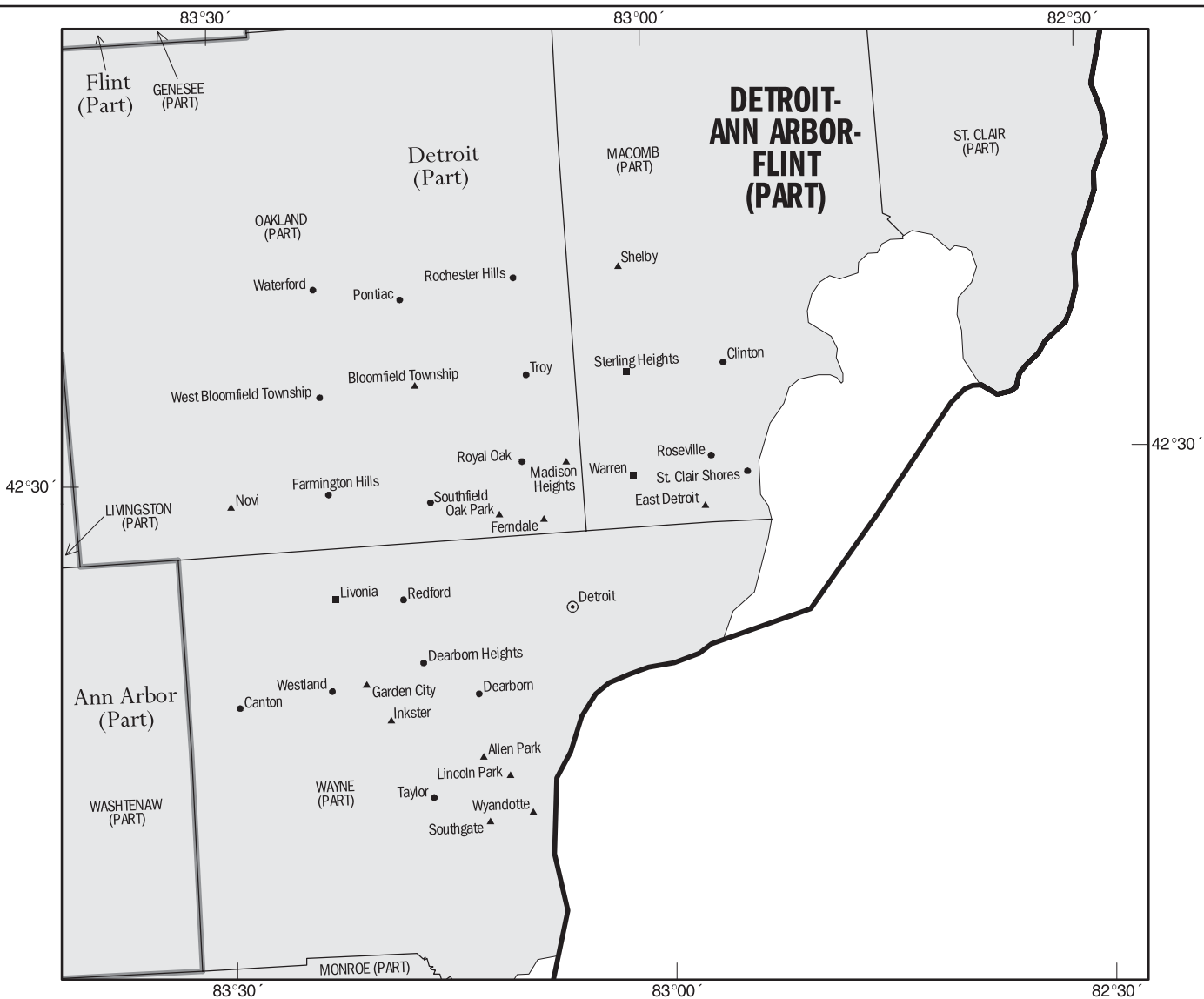




MICHIGAN - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

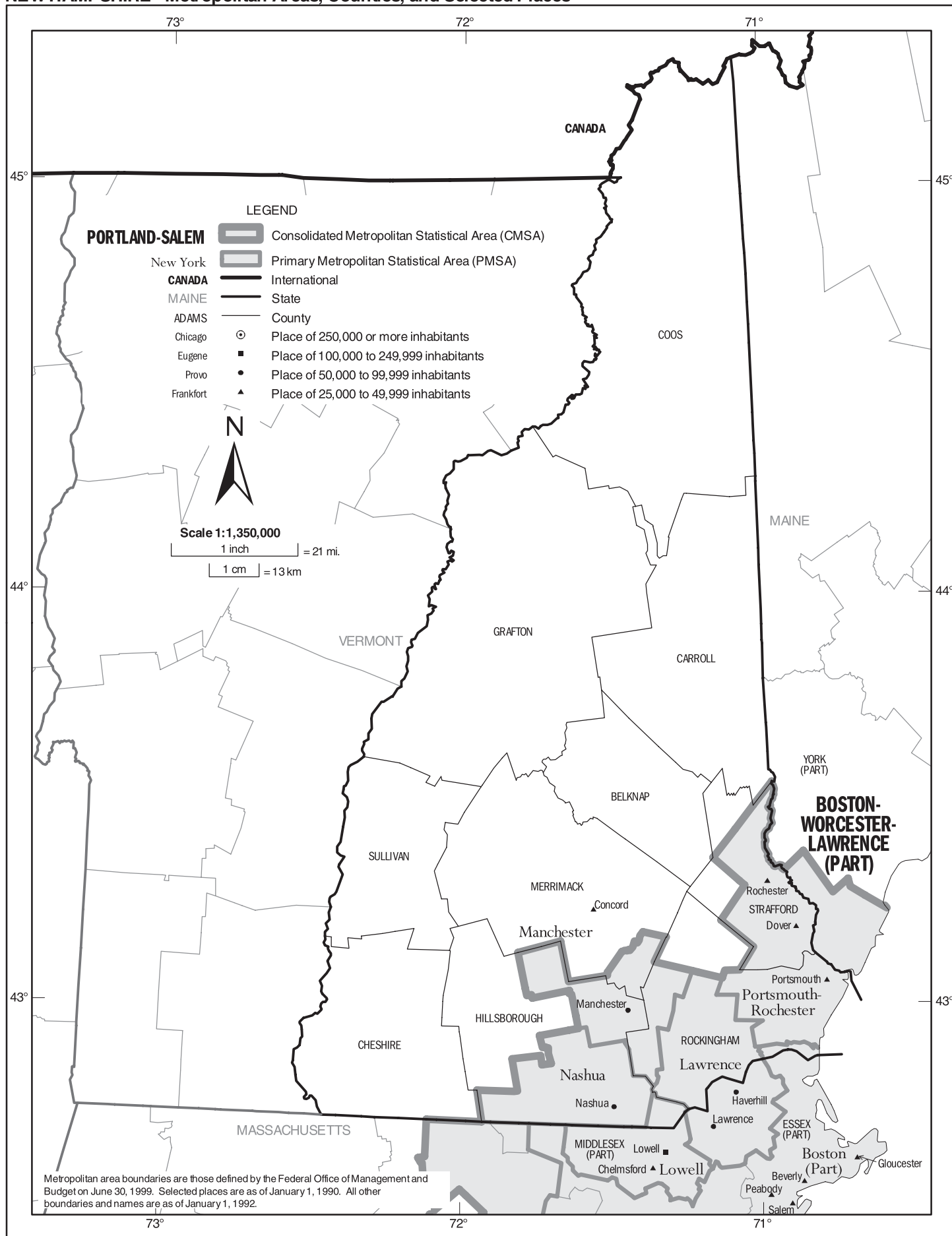


NEVADA - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, Independent City, and Selected Places



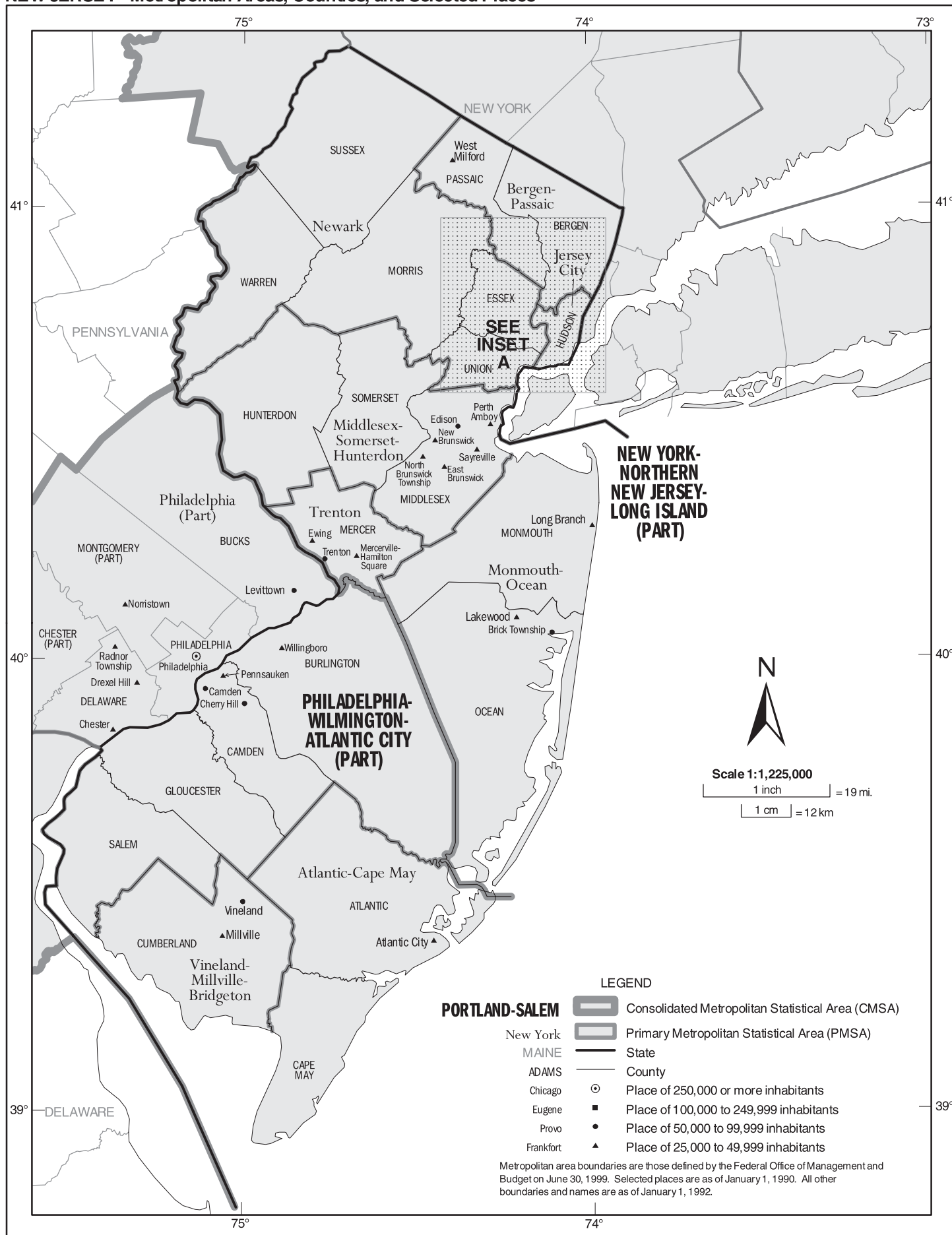

NEW HAMPSHIRE - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places



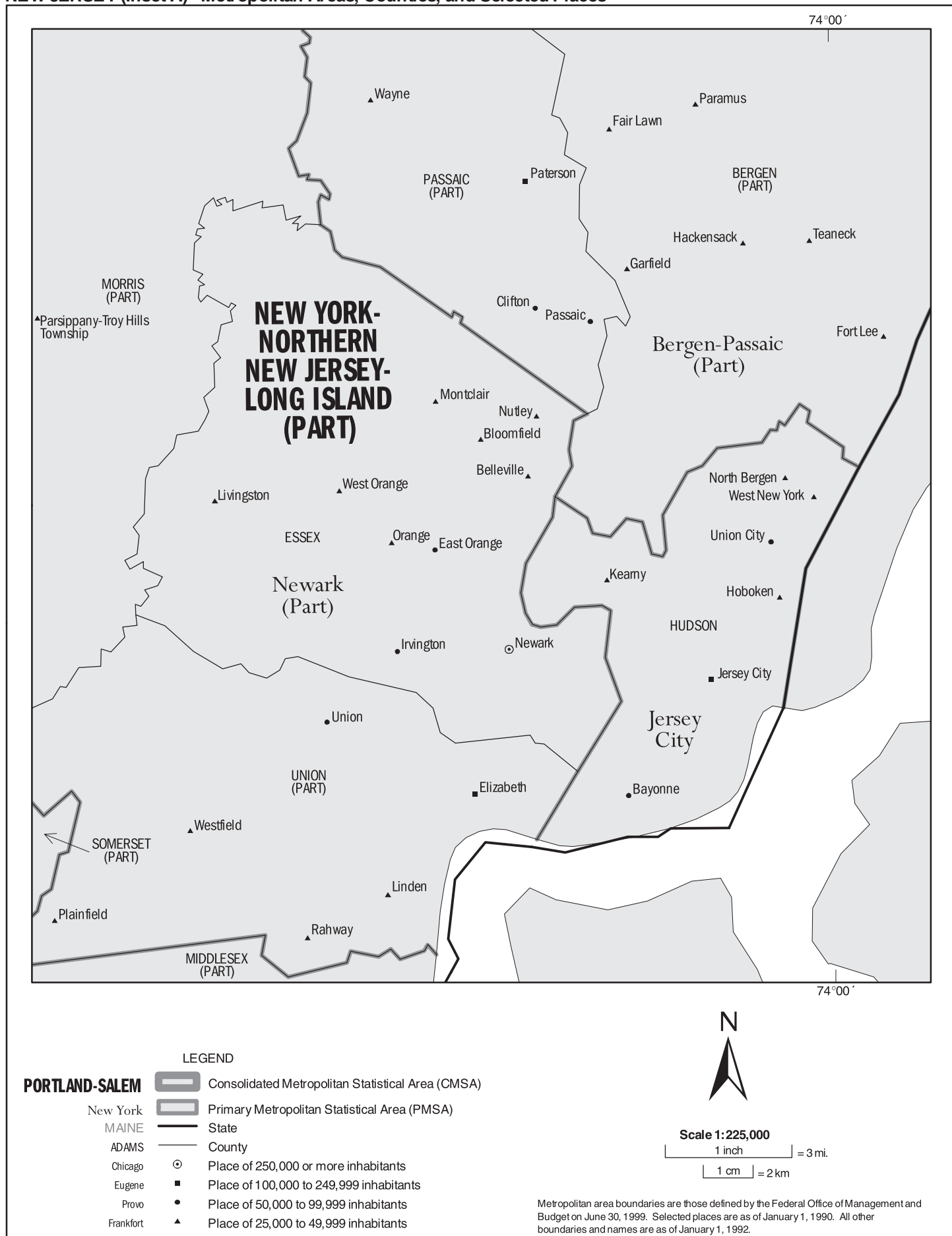

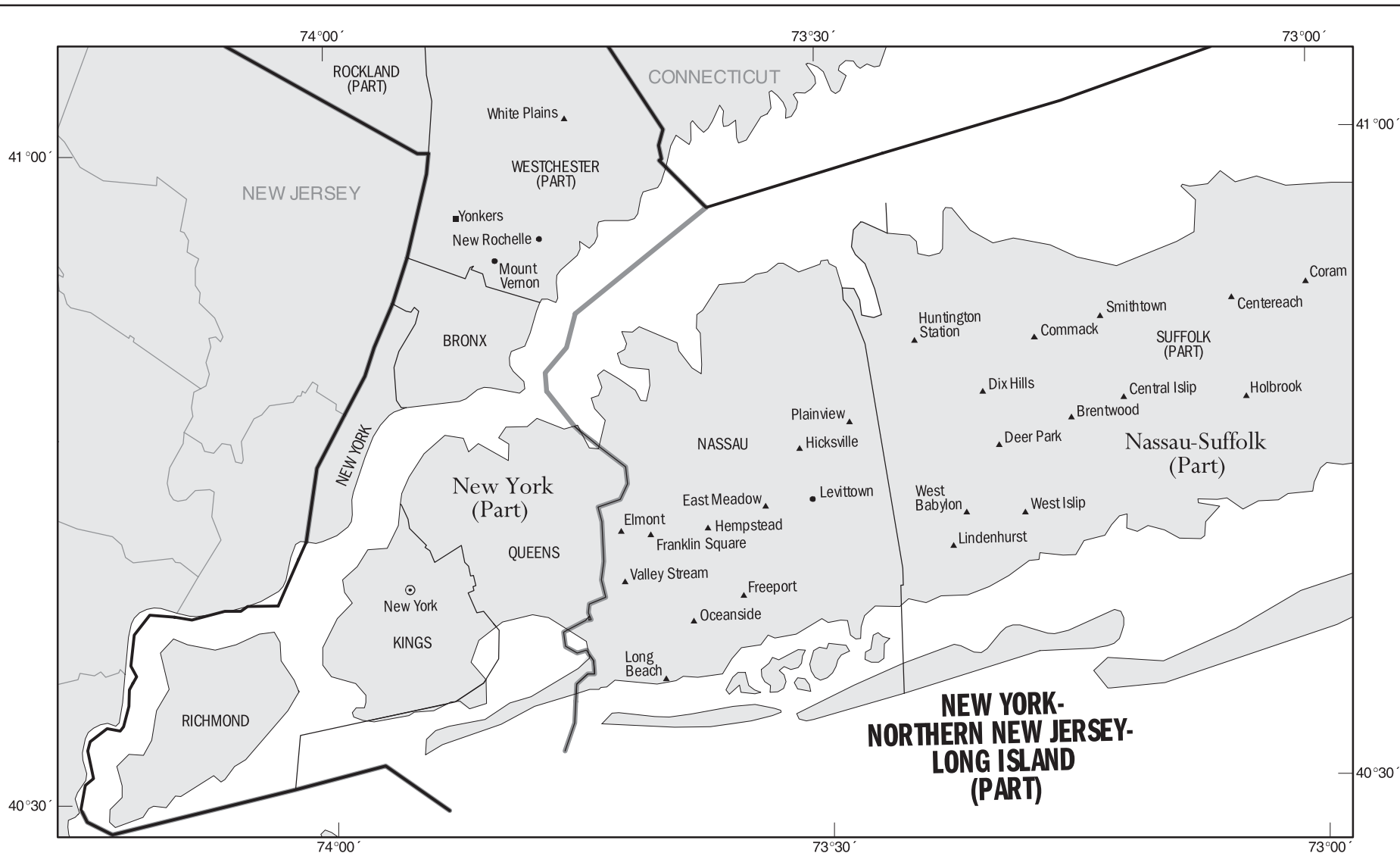


NEW MEXICO - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

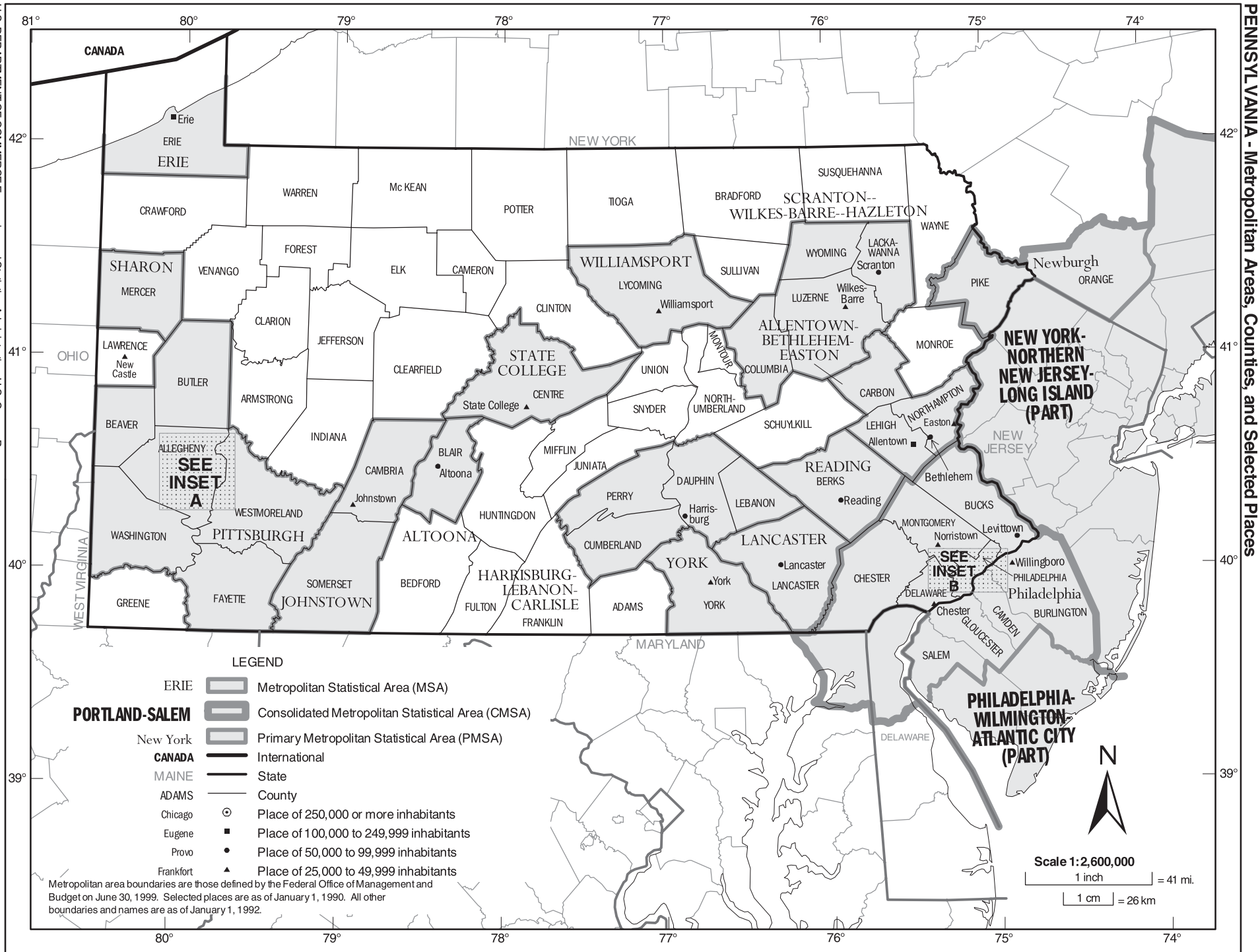
OHIO (Inset A) - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places



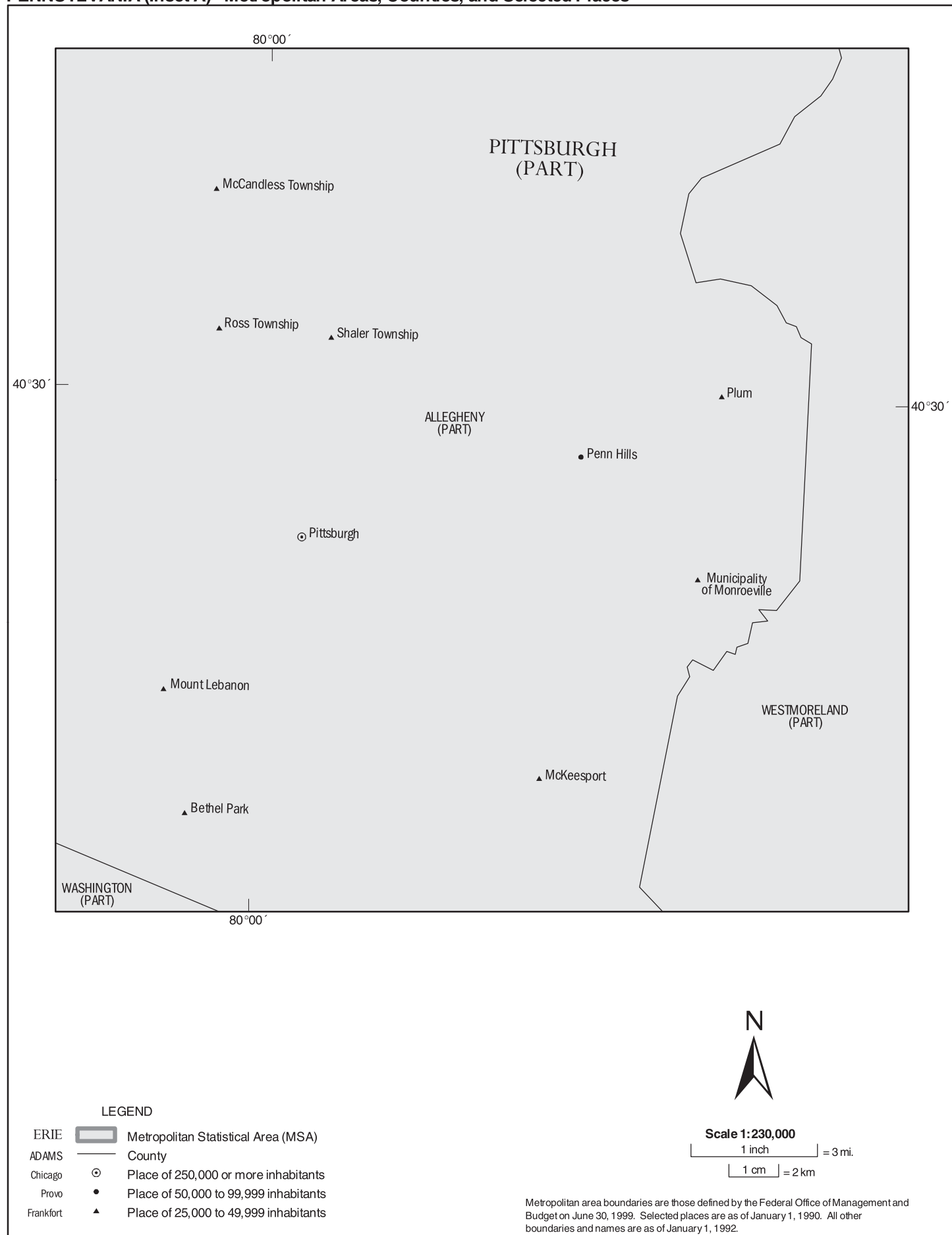


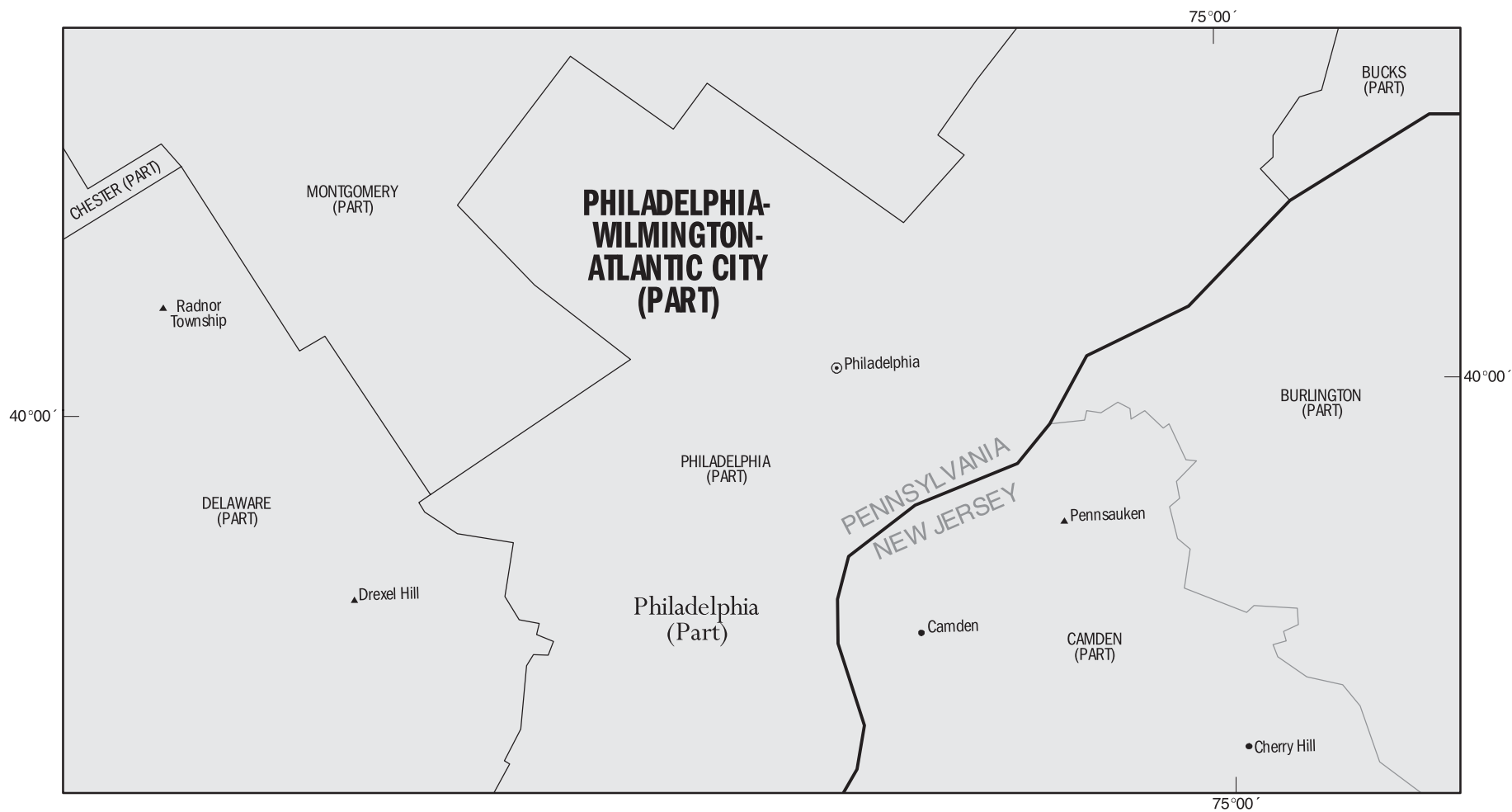

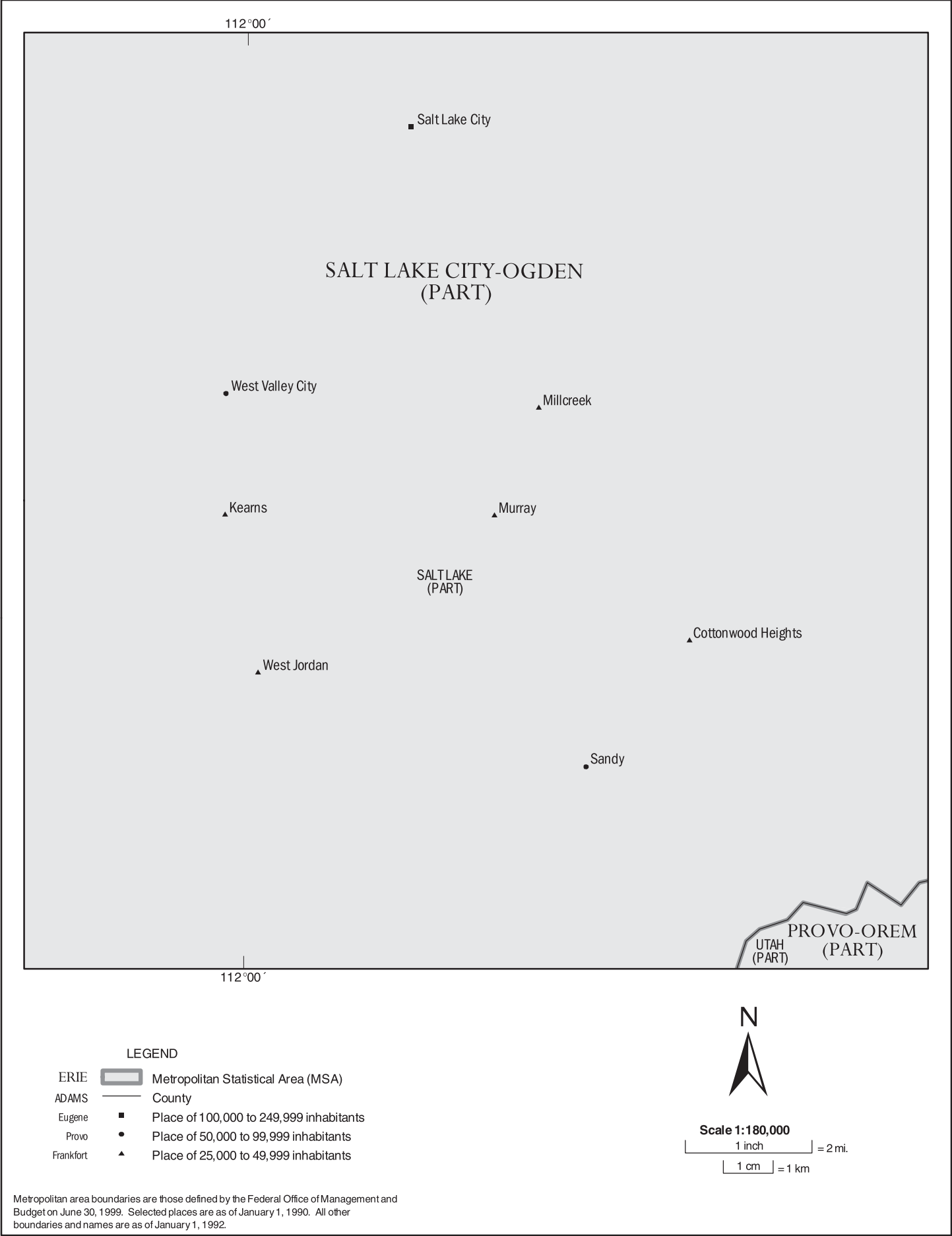


UTAH - Metropolitan Areas, Counties, and Selected Places

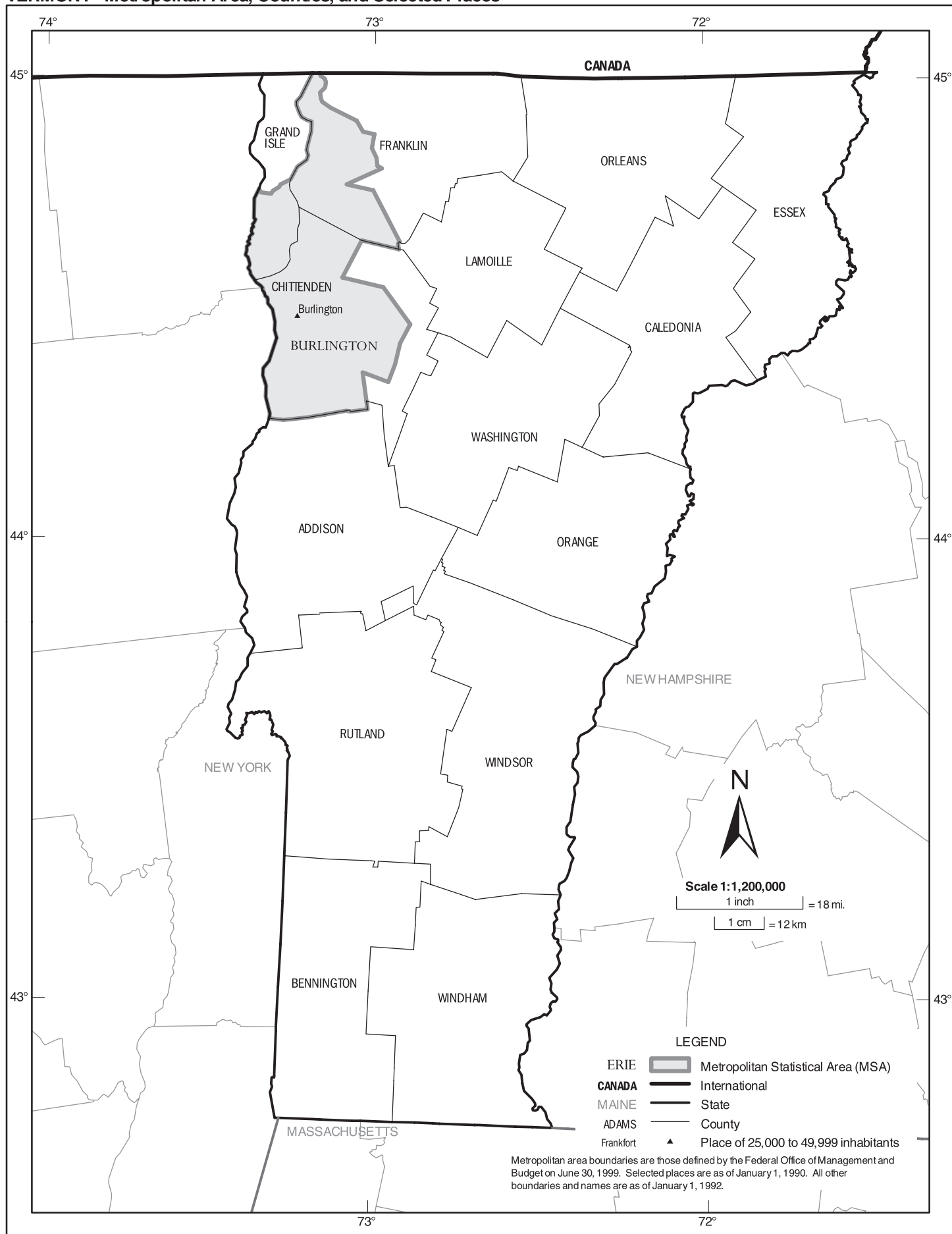

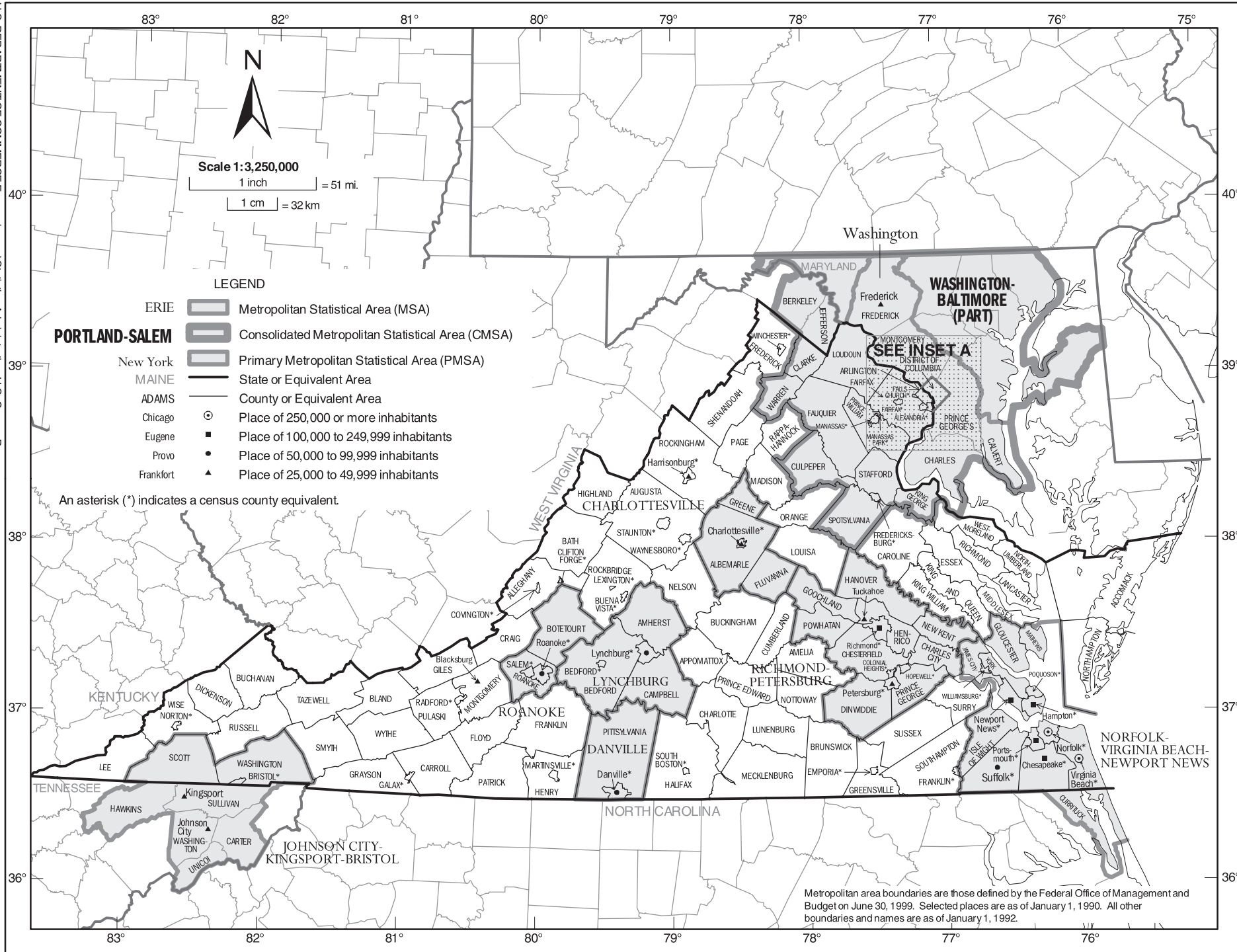

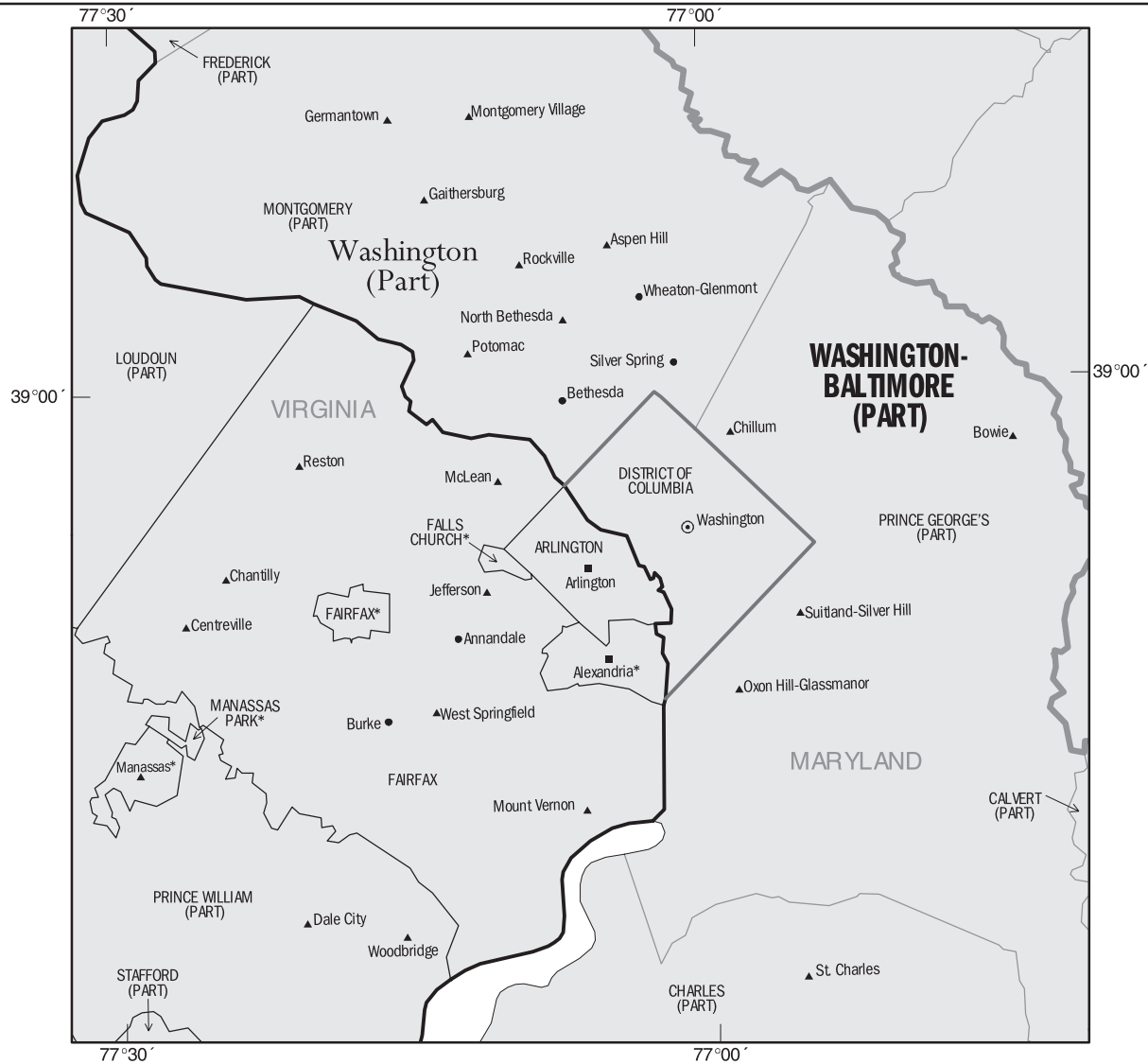


VERMONT - Metropolitan Area, Counties, and Selected Places

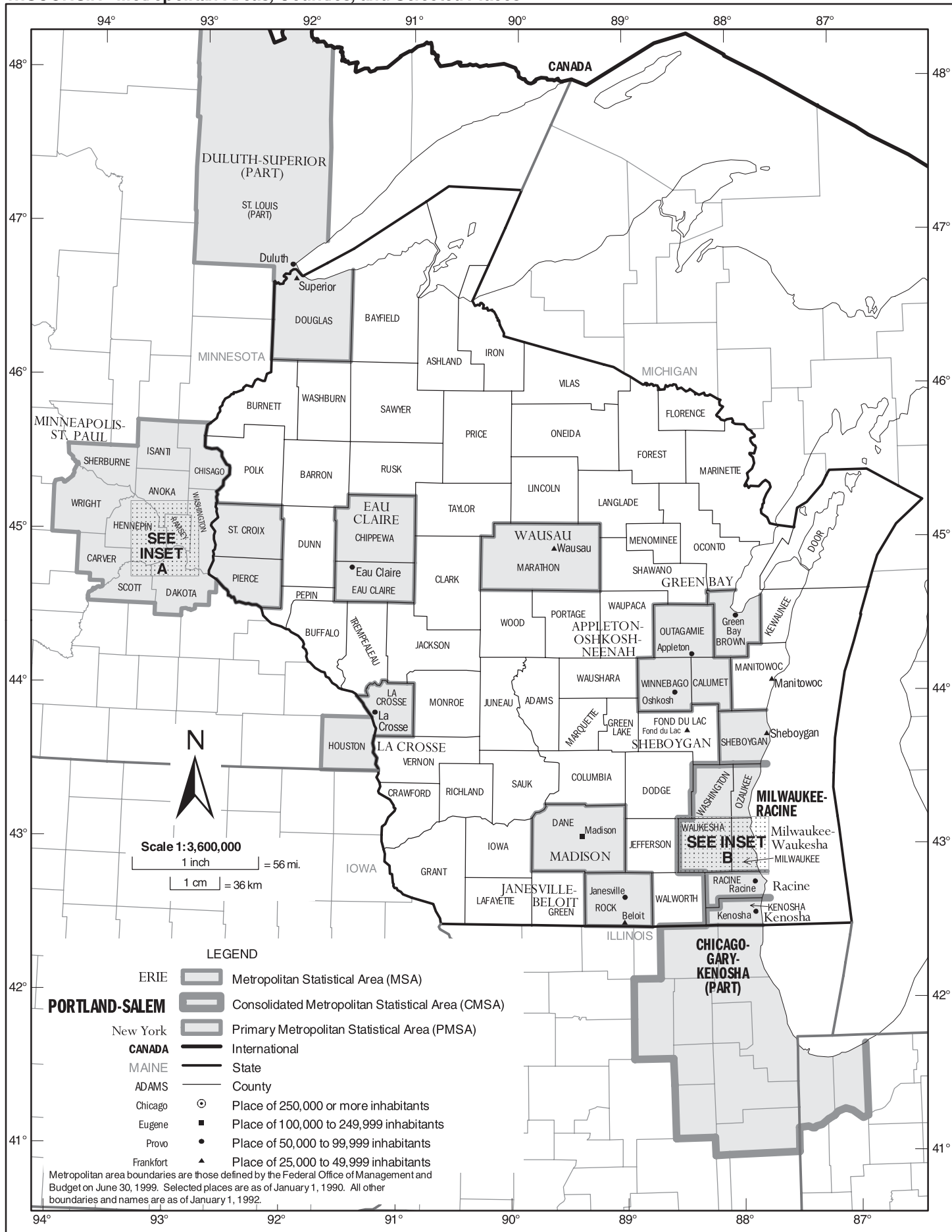
