
CALIFORNIA STATE EXPORTS



- # California is the country's largest exporting state. In 1999, California's goods exports were \$109.8 billion, up 50 percent (\$36.7 billion) from 1992.
- # Nearly 1.2 million California jobs were supported by goods exports in 1999, an estimated 11.1 percent (119,180 jobs) higher than 1992. U.S. jobs supported by goods exports pay 13 to 16 percent higher than the national average wage.
- # In 1991, the latest year available, California's exports accounted for 21.3 percent of its manufacturing output and represented 20.5 percent of its total manufacturing employment.
- # California's exports of manufactured products were up by 52 percent between 1993 and 1999 (from \$67.1 billion in 1993 to \$101.8 billion in 1999).
- # The five largest manufacturing sectors in terms of California's exports were: Electronic and Electric Equipment (\$29.8 billion of exports in 1999), Industrial Machinery and Computers (\$28.9 billion), Transportation Equipment (\$12.3 billion), Scientific and Measuring Instruments (\$9.2 billion), and Food Products (\$4.3 billion). These five sectors accounted for 77 percent of the state's total exports in 1999.

Among California's fastest growing manufactured exports (in billions) were:

- # California is the country's largest agricultural exporting state, shipping \$6.9 billion in agricultural exports abroad or 14.1% of the U.S. total in FY 1999. The largest export categories, vegetables, fruit, and tree nuts, accounted for 64 percent of California's agricultural exports in FY 1999.
- # Total exports from California to NAFTA countries in 1999 were 111 percent higher than 1993 (pre-NAFTA), rising from \$13.3 billion in 1993 to \$28.1 billion in 1999. During 1999, Canada was California's second largest export market, while Mexico was California's third largest export market. Exports to Canada in 1999 were 92 percent (\$7.0 billion) higher than 1993, to \$14.6 billion in 1999. Exports to Mexico in 1999 were 137 percent (\$7.8 billion) higher than 1993, to \$13.5 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, total exports from California to Japan were 27 percent (\$3.3 billion) higher than 1993, to \$15.2 billion in 1999. During 1999, Japan was California's largest export market.
- # In 1999, total exports from California to the European Union were 45 percent (\$7.1 billion) higher than 1993, to \$22.9 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, California exported \$4.4 billion to South/Central America and the Caribbean (excluding Mexico), \$29.3 billion to the Pacific Rim (excluding Japan and China) and \$125.6 million to SubSaharan Africa.
- # In 1999, California exported \$2.8 billion to China, its 11th largest export partner.
