


CONNECTICUT GOODS EXPORTS





- # In 1999, Connecticut's goods exports were \$12.0, billion up 5 percent (\$526 million) from 1992. During 1999, Connecticut was the 15th largest state exporter of goods.
- # In 1999, Connecticut's jobs supported by goods exports were an estimated 23 percent (38,369 jobs) lower than 1992. U.S. jobs supported by goods exports pay 13 to 16 percent higher than the national average wage.
- # In 1991, the latest year available, Connecticut's exports accounted for 25.9 percent of its manufacturing output and represented 24.2 percent of its total manufacturing employment.
- # Connecticut's exports of manufactured products were up by 18 percent between 1993 and 1998 (from \$8.7 billion in 1993 to \$10.2 billion in 1999).
- # The five largest manufacturing sectors in terms of Connecticut's exports were: Transportation Equipment (\$2.8 billion of exports in 1999), Chemical Products (\$1.8 billion), Industrial Machinery and Computers (\$1.1 billion), Scientific and Measuring Instruments (\$957.8 million), and Electronic and Electric Equipment (\$787.6 million). These five sectors accounted for 62 percent of the state's total exports in 1999.
- # Among Connecticut fastest growing manufactured exports (in billions) were:

- # Connecticut is the country's 40th largest agricultural exporting state, shipping \$93 million in agricultural exports abroad in FY 1999.
- # Total exports from Connecticut to NAFTA countries in 1999 were 44 percent higher than 1993 (pre-NAFTA), rising from \$2.0 billion in 1993 to \$2.9 billion in 1999. During 1999, Canada was Connecticut's largest export market, while Mexico was Connecticut's fourth largest export market. Exports to Canada in 1999 were 29 percent (\$488 million) higher than 1993, to \$2.2 billion in 1999. Exports to Mexico in 1999 were 110 percent (\$399 million) higher than 1993, to \$762.3 million in 1999.
- # In 1999, total exports from Connecticut to Japan were running 1 percent (\$11.8 million) higher than 1993, to \$963 million in 1999. During 1999, Japan was Connecticut's second largest export market.
- # In 1999, total exports from Connecticut to the European Union were 21 percent (\$595.0 million) higher than 1993, to \$3.4 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, Connecticut exported \$1.2 billion to South/Central America and the Caribbean (excluding Mexico), \$1.8 billion to the Pacific Rim (excluding Japan and China) and \$73.3 million to SubSaharan Africa.
- # In 1999, Connecticut exported \$144.3 million to China, its 21st largest export market.
