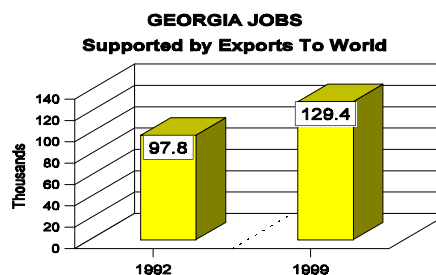
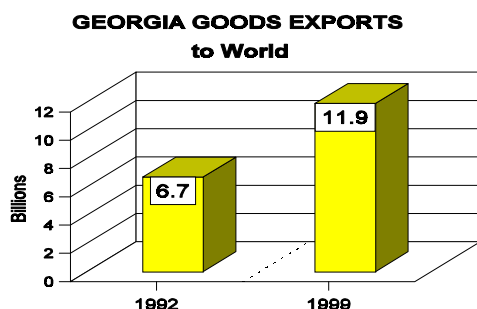


# GEORGIA STATE EXPORTS



- # In 1999, Georgia's goods exports were \$11.9 billion, up 79 percent (\$5.3 billion) from 1992. During 1999, Georgia was the 16th largest state exporter of goods.
- # In 1999, Georgia's jobs supported by goods exports were an estimated 32 percent (31,621 jobs) higher than 1992. U.S. jobs supported by goods exports pay 13 to 16 percent higher than the national average wage.
- # In 1991, the latest year available, Georgia's exports accounted for 15.7 percent of its manufacturing output and represented 14.8 percent of its total manufacturing employment.
- # Georgia's exports of manufactured products were up by 84 percent between 1993 and 1999 (from \$6.1 billion in 1993 to \$11.1 billion in 1999).
- # The five largest manufacturing sectors in terms of Georgia's exports were: Transportation Equipment (\$2.1 billion of exports in 1999), Electronic and Electric Equipment (\$1.6 billion), Industrial Machinery and Computers (\$1.5 billion), Chemical Products (\$1.0 billion), and Paper Products (\$1.0 billion). These five sectors accounted for nearly 61 percent of the state's total exports in 1999.
- # Among Georgia's fastest growing manufactured exports (in billions) were:

- # Georgia is the country's 19th largest agricultural exporting state, shipping \$867 million in agricultural exports abroad or 1.8% of the U.S. total in FY 1999. The largest export categories, poultry, and cotton and lint, accounted for 48 percent of Georgia's agricultural exports in FY 1999.
- # Total exports from Georgia to NAFTA countries in 1999 were 94 percent higher than 1993 (pre-NAFTA), rising from \$2.0 billion in 1993 to \$3.9 billion in 1999. During 1999, Canada was Georgia's largest export market, while Mexico was Georgia's second largest export market. Exports to Canada in 1999 were 48 percent (\$795 million) higher than 1993, to \$2.4 billion in 1999. Exports to Mexico in 1999 were 305 percent (\$1.1 billion) higher than 1993, to \$1.5 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, total exports from Georgia to Japan were 65 percent (\$290 million) higher than 1993, to \$737 million in 1999. During 1999, Japan was Georgia's fourth largest export market.
- # In 1999, total exports from Georgia to the European Union were 110 percent (\$1.6 billion) higher than 1993, to \$3.0 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, Georgia exported \$1.6 billion to South/Central America and the Caribbean (excluding Mexico), \$1.5 billion to the Pacific Rim (excluding Japan and China) and \$76.7 million to SubSaharan Africa.
- # In 1999, Georgia exported \$189.7 million to China, its 13<sup>th</sup> largest export market.
