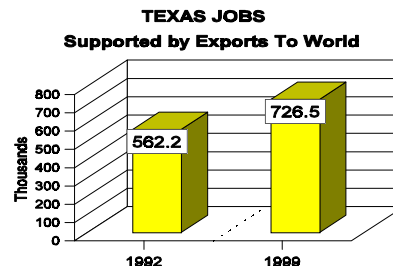
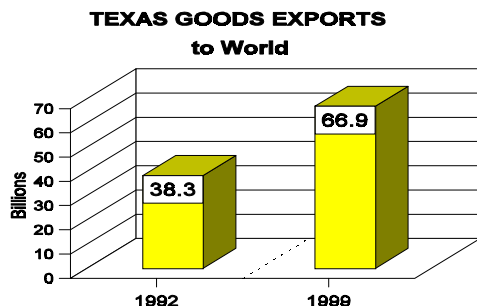


TEXAS STATE EXPORTS



- # In 1999, Texas goods exports were \$66.9 billion, up 75 percent (\$28.6 billion) from 1992. During 1999, Texas was the second largest state exporter of goods.
- # In 1999, Texas' jobs supported by goods exports were an estimated 29 percent (164,312 jobs) higher than 1992. U.S. jobs supported by goods exports pay 13 to 16 percent higher than the national average wage.
- # In 1991, the latest year available, Texas exports accounted for 21.1 percent of its manufacturing output and represented 23.9 percent of its total manufacturing employment.
- # Texas' exports of manufactured products were up by 71 percent between 1993 and 1999 (from \$37.4 billion in 1993 to \$64.1 billion in 1999).
- # The five largest manufacturing sectors in terms of Texas' exports were: Electronic and Electric Equipment (\$17.0 billion of exports in 1999), Industrial Machinery and Computers (\$13.3 billion), Chemical Products (\$9.6 billion), Transportation Equipment (\$5.3 billion), and Scientific and Measuring Instruments (\$2.6 billion). These five sectors accounted for over 70 percent of the state's total exports in 1999.
- # Among Texas fastest growing manufactured exports (in billions) were:

- # Texas is the country's sixth largest agricultural exporting state, shipping \$2.5 billion in agricultural exports abroad or 5.1% of the U.S. total in FY 1999. The largest export categories, live animals and meat (excluding poultry), cotton and lint, and feed grains, accounted for 52 percent of Texas' agricultural exports in FY 1999.
- # Total exports from Texas to NAFTA countries in 1999 were 89 percent higher between 1993 (pre-NAFTA), rising from \$19.0 billion in 1993 to \$35.9 billion in 1999. During 1999, Mexico was Texas' largest export market, while Canada was Texas' second largest export market. Exports to Canada in 1999 were 126 percent (\$5.7 billion) higher than 1993, to \$10.2 billion in 1999. Exports to Mexico in 1999 were 77 percent (\$11.2 billion) higher than 1993, to \$25.7 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, total exports from Texas to Japan were 46 percent (\$690 million) higher than 1993, to \$2.2 billion in 1999. During 1999, Japan was Texas' third largest export market.
- # In 1999, total exports from Texas to the European Union were 47 percent (\$2.3 billion) higher than 1993, to \$7.1 billion in 1999.
- # In 1999, Texas exported \$6.3 billion to South/Central America and the Caribbean (excluding Mexico), \$9.4 billion to the Pacific Rim (excluding Japan and China) and \$779.7 million to SubSaharan Africa.
- # In 1999, Texas exported \$899.0 million to China, its 15th largest export market.
