VERMONT STATE EXPORTS





- # In 1999, Vermont's goods exports were \$3.0 billion, up 43 percent (\$910 million) from 1992. During 1999, Vermont was the 33rd largest state exporter of goods.
- # In 1999, Vermont's jobs supported by goods exports were an estimated 6 percent (1,709 jobs) higher than 1992. U.S. jobs supported by goods exports pay 13 to 16 percent higher than the national average wage.
- # In 1991, the latest year available, Vermont's exports accounted for 20.6 percent of its manufacturing output and represented 18.5 percent of its total manufacturing employment.
- # Vermont's exports of manufactured products were up by 15 percent between 1993 and 1999 (from \$2.6 billion in 1993 to \$3.0 billion in 1999).
- # The five largest manufacturing sectors in terms of Vermont's exports were: Electronic and Electric Equipment (\$2.3 billion of exports in 1999), Industrial Machinery and Computers (\$140 million), Transportation Equipment (\$98 million), Fabricated Metal Products (\$68 million), and Scientific and Measuring Instruments (\$56 million). These five sectors accounted for 89 percent of the state's total exports in 1999. Electronic and Electric Equipment accounted for 77 percent of Vermont's total exports.
- # Among Vermont's fastest growing manufactured exports (in millions) were:

- # Vermont is the country's 46th largest agricultural exporting state, shipping \$10 million in agricultural exports abroad in FY 1999.
- # Total exports from Vermont to NAFTA countries in 1999 were 7 percent (\$174 million) higher than 1993 (pre-NAFTA), from \$2.5 billion in 1993 to \$2.7 billion in 1999. During 1999, Canada was Vermont's largest export market, while Mexico was Vermont's seventh largest export market. Exports to Canada in 1999 were 7 percent (\$172 million) higher than 1993, to \$2.7 billion in 1999. Exports to Mexico in 1999 were 15 percent (\$2.1 million) higher than 1993, to \$16.4 million in 1999.
- # In 1999, total exports from Vermont to Japan were 149 percent (\$22.1 million) higher than 1993, to \$37.0 million in 1999. During 1999, Japan was Vermont's third largest export market.
- # In 1999, total exports from Vermont to the European Union were 123 percent (\$97 million) higher than 1993, to \$175.9 million in 1999.
- # In 1999, Vermont exported \$27.7 million to South/Central America and the Caribbean (excluding Mexico), \$65.5 million to the Pacific Rim (excluding Japan and China) and \$198.1 thousand to SubSaharan Africa.
- # In 1999, Vermont exported \$7.5 million to China, its 16th largest export market.
